## **FY 2011 Capital Budget Proposals**

Governor Parnell's administration has started their work on compiling next year's Operating and Capital budgets. I highly recommend, that communities submit their requests to the Governor's office as soon as possible.

In submitting your Capital project proposal, communities should prioritize their projects based on public health, public safety, education and the potential for matching funds (i.e. federal or private grants).

## FY 2011 Legislative Capital Project Program

Last session, the Legislature initiated a new "on-line" application process to submit a community Capital project proposal.

How it works; each Legislature's office authorizes and sets-up an on-line "code" for each community in their district that is going to submit a Capital project proposal; the code is e-mailed to the community; the community grant administrator goes to the web-site and signs-in using their code and completes the application process.

This new process proved to be a success. Over the interim, staff has continued to tweak and improve the process.

I will be sending out a notice to our communities when we start accepting applications.
